Marc Aronson, President & CEO, Pennsylvania Association of Notaries



Marc Aronson began his career 44 years ago at the Pennsylvania Association of Notaries (PAN). He has worked with the Pennsylvania Secretary of the Commonwealth in drafting legislation to improve the notary profession. A major aspect of this legislation gave the Pennsylvania notary public the ability to act as an electronic notary.

Aronson is active as an official observer on various drafting committees of the Uniform Law Commission (ULC), including the Uniform Real Property Electronic Recording Act and the Revised Uniform Law on Notarial Acts.

He also participates with the National Association of Secretaries of State, Notary Public Administrators Section; the Electronic Signature and Records Association (ESRA); the Mortgage Industry Standards Maintenance Organization (MISMO), the American Land Title Association (ALTA); the International Blockchain Real Estate Association; and other organizations interested in the notary's powers and duties in the United States.
